#### **NAPLAN TEST**

Over the last 2 weeks, students in year 3 and 5 have put in lots of effort to complete the NAPLAN test. The NAPLAN test is an important assessment tool used to measure student performance in literacy and numeracy in Australia. The test helps teachers to identify strengths and areas that need to improve, in order to provide targeted support.

It's important to celebrate the hard work that students put in for the test, regardless of their results. Encouraging a growth mindset and a focus on effort rather than just outcomes can help students develop resilience and a love for learning. It's also important to acknowledge that test results are just one measure of a student's progress and that there are many other factors that contribute to their success.

#### PICK UP AND DROP OFF AREA

It's important for parents and carers to pick up and drop off their children from the front of the school on Dolan St or McLeod St. This helps to ensure the safety of all students and staff, and prevents any unnecessary congestion or disruption on nearby streets.

By following this pick-up and drop-off procedure, parents and carers can help to minimize the risk of accidents or incidents involving students. It also helps to maintain a smooth and efficient flow of traffic around the school, making it easier for everyone to get to where they need to be. # Wellbeing Corner

### **MINDFULNESS**





While mindfulness is designed to be a practice that is beneficial to practise regularly, it can also be a really useful tool when you or your child might be experiencing specific challenges. Mindfulness can be as simple as taking a slow deep breath in through the nose, counting silently,  $1 \dots 2 \dots 3$ , and then slowly letting your breath out through your mouth, counting silently,  $1 \dots 2 \dots 3$ .

Do this at least 3 times and you will start to feel your body relax. It is a really useful tool to help with forms of anxiety, to calm anger, comfort sadness and feel strong in new situations.





# Year 4 Class Harmony Day Acrostic Poems





















# Brenton's Projects




